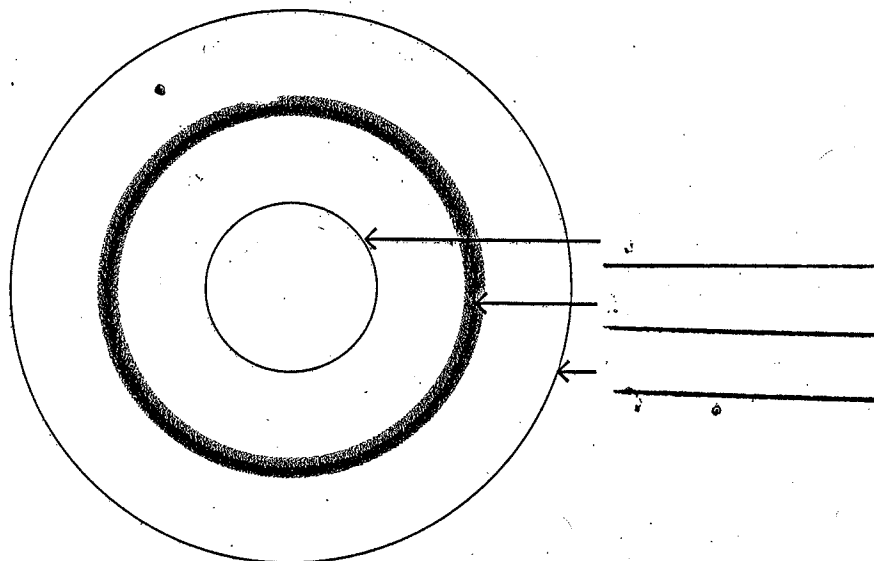
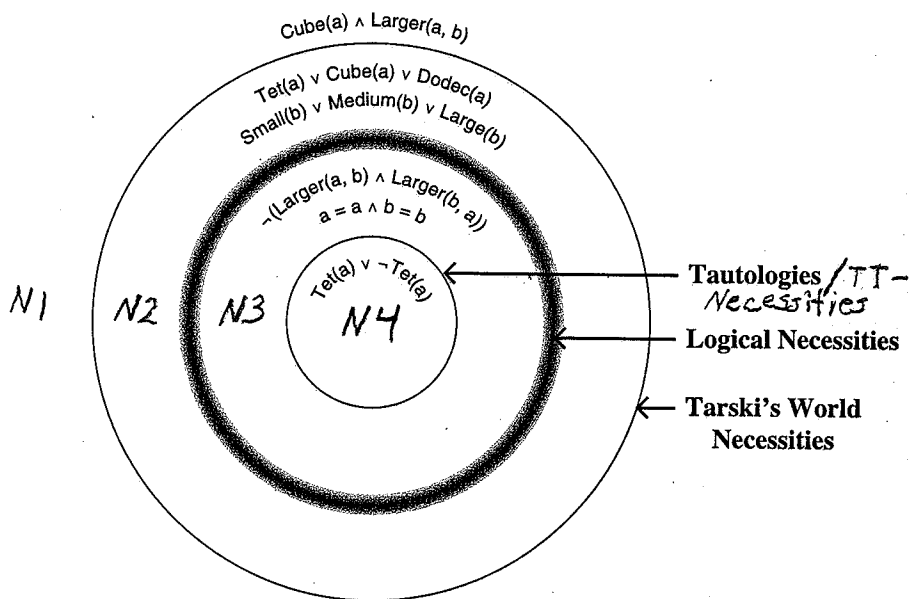


All Kinds of Necessity, Possibility, Impossibility, Equivalence, and Consequences

Types of Necessities of Sentences (p. 102)



TT-possibilities	TT-impossibilities	TT-equivalences	TT-consequences
Logical possibilities	Logical impossibilities	Logical equivalences	Logical consequences
TW-possibilities	TW-impossibilities	TW-equivalences	TW-consequences

- P and Q are * equivalent if it's * impossible for them to have different truth-values
- P and Q are * equivalent if it's * necessary that they have the same truth-value
- A conclusion is a * consequence of some premises if it's * impossible for those premises to all be true while the conclusion is false
