GARDEN CITY, L. I., June 27 .-Between them the Sweetsers cap tured just about everything in sight in the twelfth annual father and son tournament at the Garden City Golf Club today.

Jess, the former United States and British amateur champion, won the long-driving contest with a whack that traveled 242 yards 11/2 feet, and he and his father, George E., won the low gross honors in the tournament with a score of 83.

The only prizes that eluded them were those awarded for proficiency on the practice putting green. The best either of them could do there was a 37.

One hundred and fifteen pairs started out in the tournament proper, and from early morning until within an hour of sunset there was a constant procession of sons and sires around the famous old course, which holds such a proud position in the golf world—the scene of many championships and the home club of Walter J. Travis, one of the greatest golfers of all time.
