YUWO dues are \$30 per year, payable at the beginning of the academic year. Payment of dues allows participation in any YUWO activity or interest group. Some interest groups have additional fees. The YUWO Scholarship Program

The YUWO Scholarship Program was established in 1972 to help women of the Yale community resume their education after interruption or delay. The program, which is supported by donations by members and friends, as well as fund-raising events, has provided a total of 333 scholarships totaling \$384,175 in educational assistance.

YUWO's program, which is entirely separate from university financial aid, has grown to four funds:*

YUWO Fall 2016 Bus Tour Thursday, October 6, 2016 Clark Art Museum Williamstown, MA

Set within beautiful grounds and walking trails, The Clark is one of the finest small art museums in the country. Their Permanent Collection includes European and American paintings, decorative arts and sculpture, with an outstanding group of French Impressionist paintings. Their special exhibition is "Splendor Myth and Vision: Nudes from the Prado," 28 Old Master paintings, most of which have never been shown before in America: works by Titian, Rubens, Tintoretto, Velasquez, Brueghel, Poussin and others.

In 2014 the architect Tadao Ando completed additions and renovations to The Clark, including their one-acre reflecting pools. A multi-media guide to the collections is available for \$5, or you could download a free app for iTunes or GooglePlay. You might want to read the book *The Clarks of Cooperstown*, published in 2007. The fall foliage color should be spectacular on this trip.

Lunch is on your own. The Museum café is on the entrance level. There are picnic tables if you bring your own lunch.

Cost of \$80 includes bus travel, driver's tip and admissions to The Clark Art Museum. Our bus leaves the North Haven commuter lot on Devine Street (Exit 10 off I-91) promptly at 7:30 am our bus. We leave The Clark at 3:30 pm, returning by 6:30 pm.



The Fall 2016 Study Group lecture series is on “Current Issues in Public Health.” Dates of the lectures are September 28, October 5, 9, and 26, and November 2 at 10:30 am at the the Yale West Campus Conference Center. (Note that there is no lecture on October 12, Yom Kippur.)

The keynote speaker on September 28 will be Marta Moret, President of Urban Policy Strategies, an evaluation research and policy consulting group aimed at bridging the gap between the research and science of public health, education and social services and the best practices of community organizations. Marta has more than 15 years of national, state, and local research and policy experience. She has effectively used the tools of research and policy to enhance the capacity of African American and Latino community organizations to effectively implement intervention and prevention programs on behalf of under-served children and families. Marta is married to Yale president, Peter Salovey.
